CONSULTATION MEETINGS ON THE FUTURE OF CHURCHES TOGETHER IN KENT

A series of meetings is being held in the Autumn to sample local views about Churches Together in Kent (CTK). This is part of a research project which will inform decisions about the way that CTK works and the future role of the paid officer. There will be five meetings across Greater Kent. The issues to be raised will include the model of belonging that is appropriate for LCTGs; the relationship between CTK and LCTGs; how CTK might best support the local groups (other than LEPs); what is the dimension of ministry that will release energy for LCTGs rather than absorbing it; how the available money for a paid officer might best be spent. Each meeting will last for 55 minutes.
